They ran a mentoring programme to encourage and develop more diverse senior leaders and so far 36 people have graduated from or are being mentored through the scheme.

Liz added: "We're delighted to be recognised for our experience in the housing association sector, our reputation for championing women in construction and for this programme that helps develop talent and remove glass ceilings."
